



## **2019 AZ Scholastic State Championship** **Player/Family/Coaches Conduct Policy**

SACA's objective is to hold a harmonious and enjoyable tournament where all players and parents conduct themselves in a respectful manner. Therefore, SACA has instituted a **ZERO TOLERANCE** conduct policy for all players, including parents, family members, coaches, or responsible adults. All players and family are expected to follow the policy outlined below.

### **Policy Details**

- **Players, parents, coaches or other spectators may not bring food onto the public areas at the La Paloma resort.** You may only bring food into your hotel room to be eaten there. This a contractual agreement SACA must uphold.
- **Players 12 and under may not be left unattended and must be under the supervision of a parent or responsible adult.**
- **Players must always be respectful to staff, players, or non-tournament guests.**
- **Players/parents must stay in designated areas and engage in non-disruptive activities such as reading, board/electronic games or talking with friends when not playing a tournament game.**
- **Parents and coaches may not set up personal chairs on the La Paloma resort property.**
- **Players, etc., may not play in streets or parking lots.**
- **Use of the La Paloma resort facilities such as the pool and water slide are restricted to those with a La Paloma hotel room key. Sneaking into the pool area without a key is not permitted.**
- **Players, etc., may not throw anything indoors including balls, food, trash, etc.**
- **Players, etc., may not run through the La Paloma resort property.**
- **Players, etc., may not enter private areas or other meeting rooms, or disturb other La Paloma resort guests.**
- **Players, etc., may not block public access or fire routes, or commit acts of vandalism (i.e. damage any La Paloma property).**
- **Players, etc., may not leave garbage/debris anywhere except in designated trash bins.**
- **Tables and chairs in the Lantana and Verbena rooms are only for use by the teams that paid to reserve them. Tables and chairs in public areas are for general use and may not be reserved when unoccupied.**

Failure to comply with these rules may result in a warning, forfeiture, or more likely, an immediate ejection from the tournament depending on the severity of the infraction. Tournament staff and La Paloma resort staff have the final word on ejections. There will be no possibility of appeal or refund of tournament fees.
